These days we see how the governments approve urgent measures to try to improve the situation. In Germany, for instance, a series of economic decisions have been taken, which were not seen since the end of the Second World War. People's trust is currently very week.

From our small NGO we are convinced that the crisis must have a personal aspect we cannot ignore: What is my responsibility within this crisis? How can I contribute to improve the situation? Solidarity is a word under suspicion. When used in public life some questions arise but a clear mind cannot rule them out right from the start. Is solidarity, as it is practiced nowadays, just a fashion? Is it in danger of becoming mere cosmetics?

Are solidarity and social corporative responsibility very convenient to institutions? Is this a straightforward utilitarism? Can we talk of solidarity when the main purpose is not to do right?

There is a new way of understanding solidarity arising in our western societies and we could call it solidarity as entertainment.

It is a kind of entertaining solidarity which, with the help of the media, mixes game and competition with altruism and solidarity; where utilitarism, recreation and solidarity come together.

Institutional and social movements, NGO's, together with TV channels and radio stations make people believe that they act with solidarity while being entertained, amused and enjoy the sponsor company advertising. This has resulted on business advertisements being compared to solidarity and therefore on said solidarity ending up being entertaining.

Thus acting with solidarity is not something merely profitable, but at the same time also enjoyable. It is a painless solidarity, where work and struggle become fun and where compromise becomes entertainment. It's like if the mere attendance to a concert, the buy of an offered product or so were to eradicate the problem. We are thus all a little patrons.

Are you contrary to violence? Buy Benetton clothes. If you wish to fight for the elimination of anti-personnel mines use Lois jeans.

Alms are included in the buy. Hence a painless way to purge bad conscience. We don't even have to move a finger in order to help. This entertaining solidarity is duty-free solidarity and it leads us to distancing and makes us not to worry about the true reasons that have caused the problem.

This causes the giving in of critical judgment where collaborator companies and their economic contributions are more important than the thinking and analysis of the reasons and its causes. One of our actual paradoxes is to pretend to collaborate with the pleasures and benefits that solidarity provides without having to suffer any inconvenience. We wish to proclaim solidarity to the whole universe and to escape from the consequences and from the commitments that the defense of said solidarity means.

It is obvious that it is better a little bit of solidarity, even if it is for vanity or marketing reasons, than none. But solidarity in terms of a virtue and a social value is, though, far from these grotesque concepts. What ever happened with charity practiced without ostentation so that others can see it? After all, isn't solidarity turned into another way of business strategy in a competitive market?

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CHRIST BLESS THIS HOUSE

Children are helping children in need

For several years in between the Christmas days and Epiphany I have been walking with a local group of children, a Star Boys' Singing Procession, bringing God's blessing to the people: "Christus mansionem benedicat – God bless this house" (C+M+B). There are about 150 children dressed up as the Three Wise Men walking the streets of our town (population approx. 10 000).

Since 1959 the Star Boys' Singing Procession in Germany ("Aktion Dreikönigssingen") has become the biggest charity project worldwide where children are helping children in need. It is organized by the children's association "Die Sternsinger" and the Association of German Catholic Youth Groups in every Catholic parish.

The collected money (till now are 657 Million Euro, this year about 39,7 Million Euro) is distributed among 3000 different projects in Africa, Latin America, Asia, Eastern Europe and Oceania.

Each year my twelve years old daughter and her friends are looking forward to this special event. On the day of the procession they dress up as Caspar, Melchior, Balthasar and star singers. Then we walk through cold and snowy weather to the houses of our neighbours. Throughout the years we got to know a lot of them. But each year we get to know new people. And they are looking forward to meeting us. We ring at their doors, we sing a song, we speak the blessing and write with chalk above their doors the initials: 20*C+M+B*09.

The people we meet often tell stories we wouldn't have heard otherwise and we

are touched by their lives. This year we were visiting an elderly lady and remembered the death of her husband last year. We hear about dying family members, about people caring for their partners suffering from dementia or about people who are lonely and are happy to see us. These little impressions show us the true meaning of our work.

For the first time this year my sister, her 10 years old daughter and her 6 years old son came along. As I visited them a little while ago we remembered that wonderful experience we shared. My nephew gave me a star he had made himself out of wood. Next year they will join us again and be part of the procession.

When I meet our neighbours now I look and them with different eyes and we often remember our prior meeting.

I put the wooden star at my window as a guide for me and everybody else.
